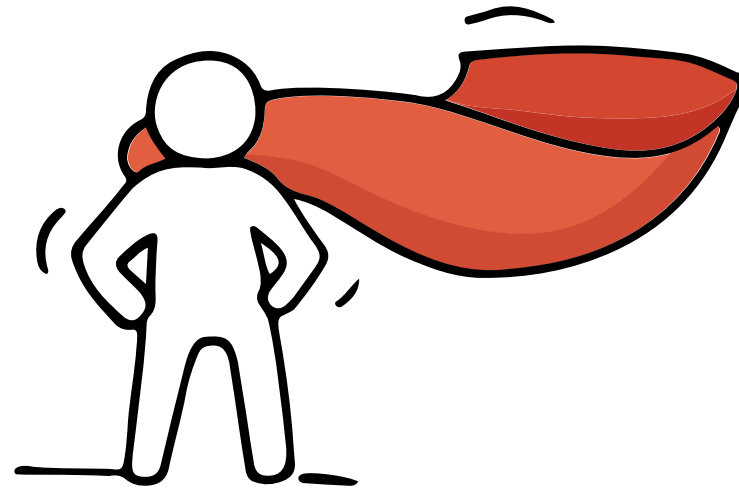


Think about your opportunities

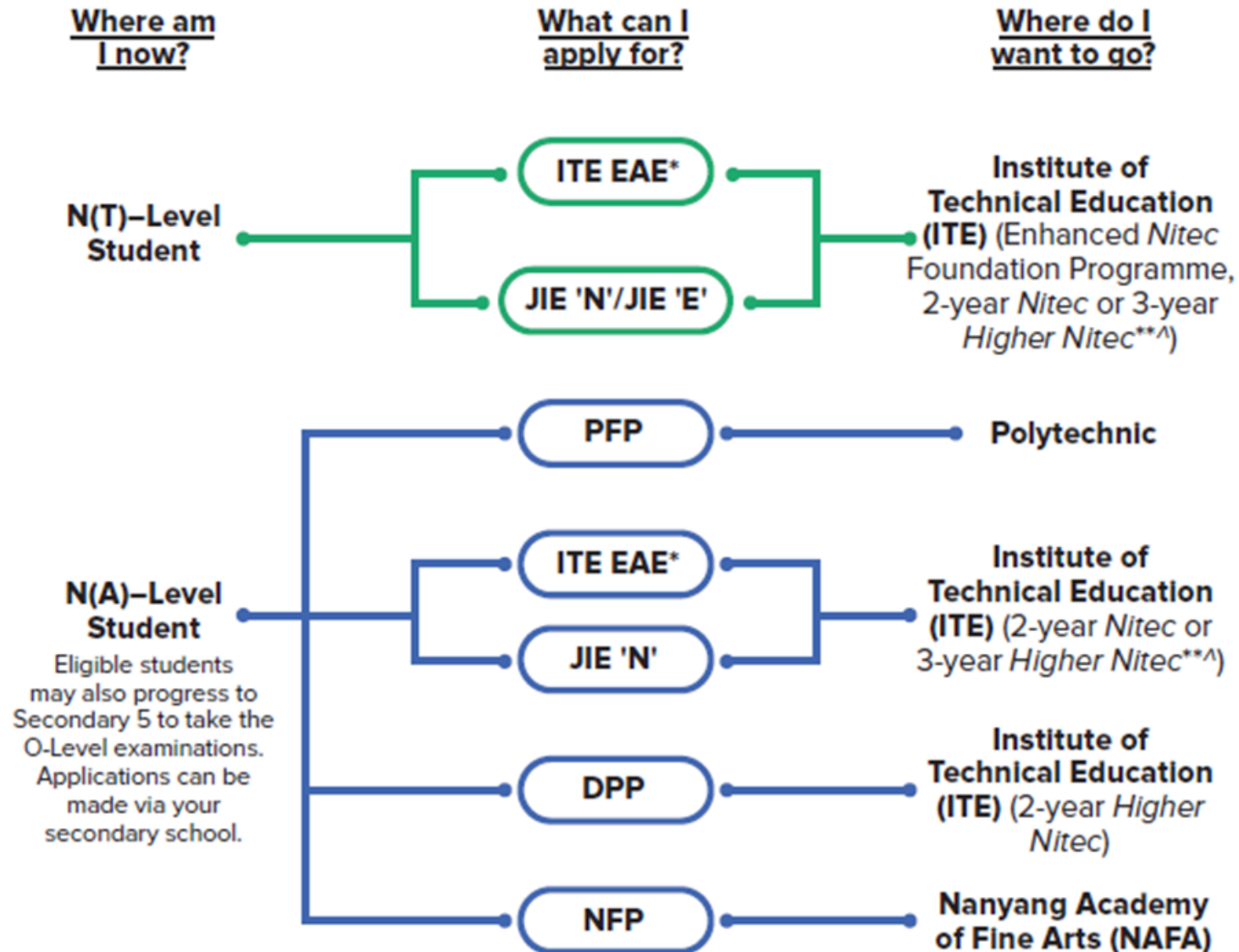

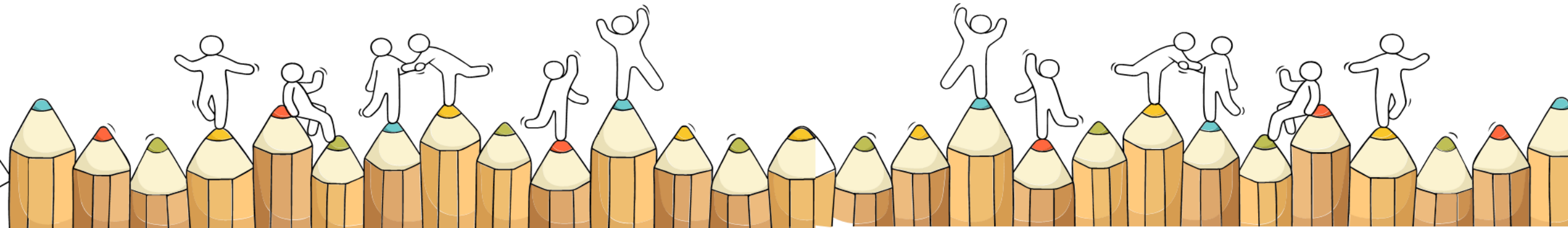

Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)	Gross ELMAB3 \leq 12 (excluding CCA bonus points) & meet course-specific entry requirements

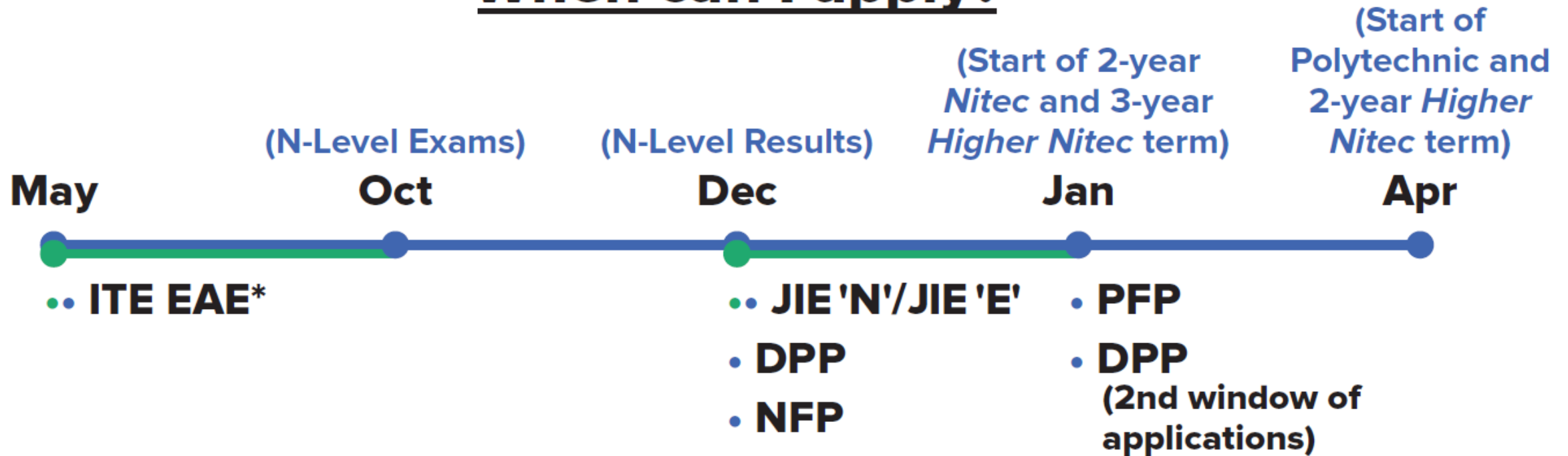

Details of Admission Exercises (1)



ITE EAE – ITE Early Admissions Exercise

ITE EAE is an aptitude-based admissions exercise that allows students to apply and receive conditional offers for admission to ITE based on their aptitude and interest, prior to receiving their final GCE N-Level examination results. It allows students to demonstrate their aptitudes and interests apart from academic grades, thus allowing a wider range of talents to be recognised.

JIE 'N'/JIE 'E' – Joint Intake Exercise

The JIE 'N' is for 2-year *Nitec* or 3-year *Higher Nitec* courses offered by ITE.

The JIE 'E' is for GCE N(T) students to apply for the 3-year *Nitec* course with Enhanced *Nitec* Foundation Programme.

Details of Admission Exercises (2)



DPP – Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme

DPP allows Secondary 4N(A) students to be admitted directly into a two-year *Higher Nitec* programme at ITE without having to sit for the O-Level examinations or undergo a *Nitec* programme.

DPP students who successfully complete their *Higher Nitec* courses at ITE and attain the required qualifying Grade Point Average (GPA) scores are guaranteed a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their *Higher Nitec* course.

NFP – NAFA Foundation Programme

The NFP is a full-time one-year practice-based programme targeted at N(A) students, to prepare them for the successful enrolment and completion of a diploma programme at NAFA. Students enrolled into the NFP are offered provisional places in their pre-selected diploma courses, and can progress to the first year of the course upon the successful completion of the NFP.

PFP – Polytechnic Foundation Programme

PFP is a one-year programme that offers a practice-oriented curriculum taught by polytechnic lecturers to better prepare polytechnic-bound N(A) students for entry into selected polytechnic diploma courses. PFP students are given provisional places in diploma programmes, subject to them passing all modules in the 1-year PFP.

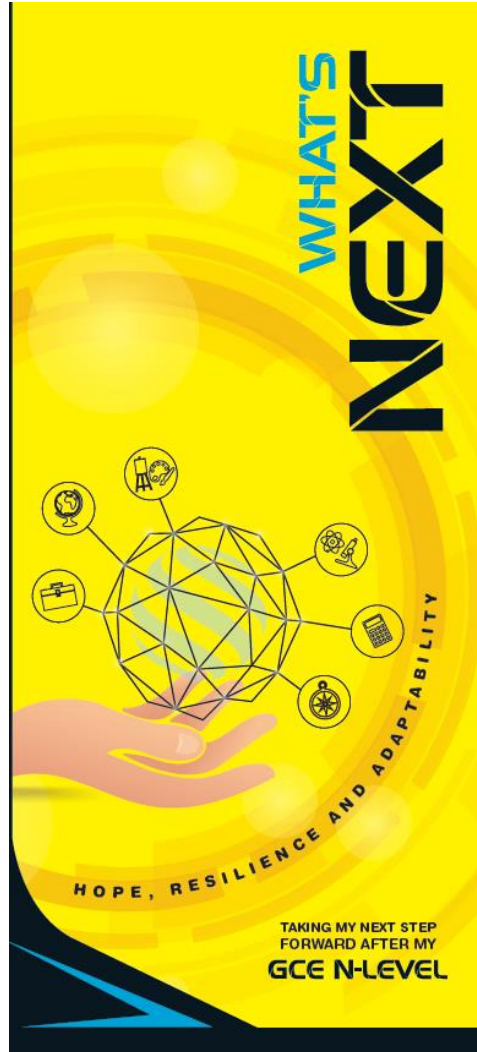

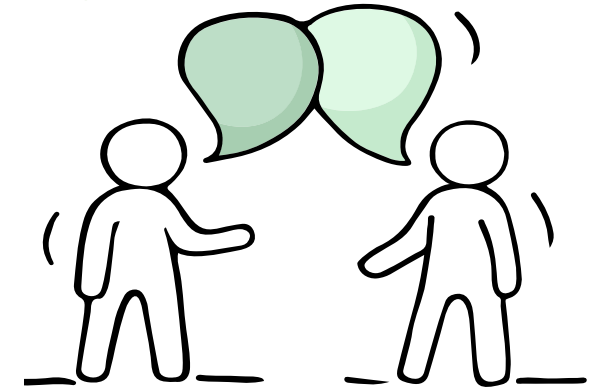
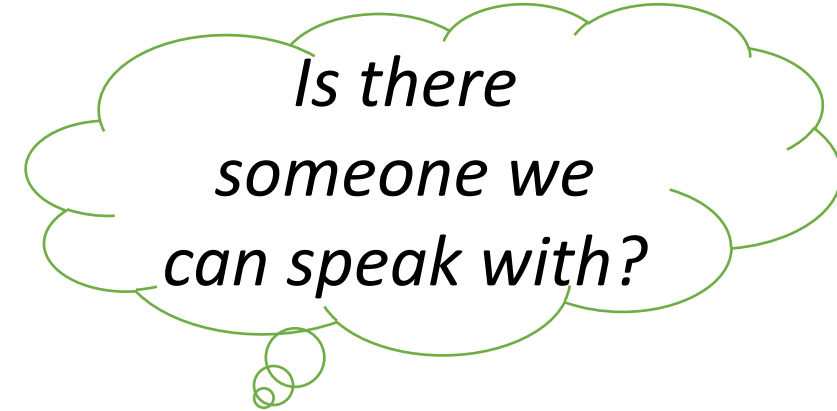

1. Direct-to-Poly Programmes

a. Polytechnic Foundation Programme (**PFP**)

PFP eligibility:

1. **ELMAB3 ≤ 12**
2. And grade 3 for ALL subjects used in the computation of ELMAB3
3. Course eligibility



Application for PFP

- The Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) is a diploma-specific foundation programme conducted over two academic semesters at the polytechnics. It caters to candidates in the N(A) course who have decided to pursue a polytechnic education and meet the PFP eligibility requirements at the end of Secondary 4.
- School candidates interested in applying for the PFP should first report to their secondary schools on [3 January 2023](#) to start their Secondary 5 year, while awaiting notification of eligibility and confirmation of a place in the PFP.
- Applications for the PFP will **open in January 2023, on the day of the GCE Ordinary-Level (O-Level) Examinations results release.** Candidates eligible for the PFP will receive a copy of **Form P** on the same day, inviting them to apply for the PFP.

1. Direct-to-Poly Programmes

b. Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

DPP eligibility:

1. **ELMAB3 ≤ 19**
2. At least Grade 4 for both EL & MA
3. Grade 5 for ALL subjects used in the computation of ELMAB3

- Advantage of choosing DPP over Sec 5N

The Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) prepares candidates for progression into selected polytechnic diploma courses via a two-year *Higher Nitec* course at ITE. Under the DPP, candidates who successfully complete their *Higher Nitec* course and attain the required minimum qualifying *Higher Nitec* Grade Point Average (GPA) are **guaranteed** a place in a polytechnic diploma course mapped to their *Higher Nitec* course. School candidates eligible for the DPP will receive a copy of Form N from their secondary schools, inviting them to apply for the DPP.

Application for DPP

- Applications for the DPP can be submitted online via the ITE application portal between [2.30pm on Monday, 19 December 2022 and 5.00pm on Thursday, 22 December 2022.](#)
- The DPP posting results will be released at [2.00pm on Friday, 23 December 2022.](#) Candidates may check the posting results online via the ITE application portal.
- Candidates who receive a DPP offer should log on to the ITE application portal between [2.00pm on Friday, 23 December 2022 and 11.59pm on Wednesday, 28 December 2022 to accept or reject the DPP offer.](#)
- School candidates who do not have a confirmed place in the DPP should report to their secondary schools on [3 January 2023](#) for Secondary 5.

2. Promotion to Sec 5

- a) ELMAB3 (English Language, Mathematics and best three other subjects) aggregate score of 19 points or less (**ELMAB3 \leq 19**)
AND
- b) At least an N(A)-level **Grade 5 for ALL subjects** used in the computation of ELMAB3

Sec 5N(A) Course

- The GCE O-level examinations:
 - is more demanding and has **greater depth and rigour**
 - will require **significantly more effort and hard work** than 'N'-level examinations
- Progression to JC/MI or polytechnics will require reasonably good L1R5/ELR2B2 scores (i.e. L1R5 / ELR2B2 **≤20**)
- Please weigh your options carefully



Application Form for Promotion to Sec 5N

1. Students interested to apply for admission to 5NA in 2023 will be required to submit the [FHSS 5NA Application Form \(Blue\)](#)
2. Students who qualify for PFP/DPP are strongly advised to consider applying for PFP/DPP over 5NA.
3. Deadline for 5NA Application Form submission to the General Office:
 - [Wednesday 21 Dec 2022 \(12 noon\)](#)
4. Student who has applied for Sec 5 but has [accepted the DPP](#) offer will need to call General Office to [withdraw from Sec 5 by 28 Dec 2022.](#)

3. Progression to ITE

Joint Intake Exercise 'N' (JIE 'N') For N(A) and N(T) students

❖ Entry requirements:

- ❖ Different Nitec courses come with different entry requirements ranging from completed GCE 'N' level to 3 GCE 'N' level passes
- ❖ Apply via ITE application portal (<https://www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ITE-courses>), between 2.30pm on Monday, 19 December 2022 and 5.00pm on Thursday, 22 December 2022
- ❖ Hard copy application forms will also be available at the Customer & Visitor Centres at the three ITE Colleges. Applicants who wish to collect a hard copy application from the Customer & Visitor Centres should book an appointment first by contacting the respective colleges via the email addresses or phone numbers provided at <https://www.ite.edu.sg/who-we-are/get-in-touch>.

Normal (Technical) course**



Progression Pathway Options for 4N(T)

1. Progression to ITE

1. **Enhanced 3-year curricular structure (Higher Nitec)** if student has ≥ 3 **N-level** passes
2. **NITEC course** if student has ≥ 2 **N-level** passes
3. **Enhanced NITEC Foundation Programme (e-NFP)** if student has < 2 **N-level** passes.
 - e-NFP will help build the necessary literacy and numeracy foundation to enable them to successfully complete their NITEC courses.
4. **Traineeship Training System/Course**
 - Earn a salary while studying as a full-time student under training companies.

2. Lateral transfer to Sec 4N(A)

- Grade A for both EL and Math, and Grade B or better for one other subject at N(T)-level in one sitting



Traineeship Training System

- Structured mode of training the enables students to earn a salary and learn work skills in an actual work environment.
 - Qualifications are the same as full-time ITE graduates
 - Salary range: \$1200 - \$2000 (industry dependent)
- Consists of 2 components:
 1. On-the-job training
 - Work under a qualified trainer in a sponsoring company
 - Enjoy work-related benefits as other employees
 - Gain a head start in your career
 2. Off-the-job training
 - Theory and practical lessons at ITE colleges depending on schedule (Block or day release for studies) and work at the sponsoring company.

Appeal For Review of 'N' Level Results

- Students who like to appeal for review of their results need to pay **S\$112.35** per subject.
- **All appeals by candidates together with the payment of appeal fees must be submitted through school to SEAB by Friday, 23 December 2022.** Applications submitted after the closing date will not be considered.
- Students are advised to appeal only if there are strong reasons.
- The outcome of the Individual Appeal is expected to be released to schools by **Friday, 27 January 2023** via email.



Certificate Amendment

- Candidates may request for a re-print of their certificate only if their name were printed wrongly due to misspelling.
- There is an administrative fee of S\$50.00 (inclusive of GST) for the amendment of each GCE N-level certificate.
- Request and payment must be submitted through school to SEAB by **31 March 2023**.
